THE HISTORY

This building is a reconstruction of a business block that was built in 1912, with three main-floor retail spaces and eight second-floor apartments. The original building still stands on the corner of 96 Street and 102A Avenue. The building's primary tenant was the Ukrainian Bookstore, established in 1914. The Bookstore served the needs of Edmonton's growing Ukrainian population by selling newspapers, books, musical instruments and other items imported from the Old World.
