

SCHEDULED MAINTENANCE ON EXISTING TRANS MOUNTAIN PIPELINE RIGHT-OF-WAY AT NORTH SASKATCHEWAN RIVER CROSSING

AUGUST 21 - SEPTEMBER 30, 2017*

Overview

As part of its ongoing safety program, Trans Mountain Pipeline L.P., affiliate of Kinder Morgan Canada Limited, will be completing scheduled routine maintenance along the existing Trans Mountain Pipeline right-of-way at the North Saskatchewan River crossing located west of Whitemud Drive NW near Fort Edmonton Park (see map).

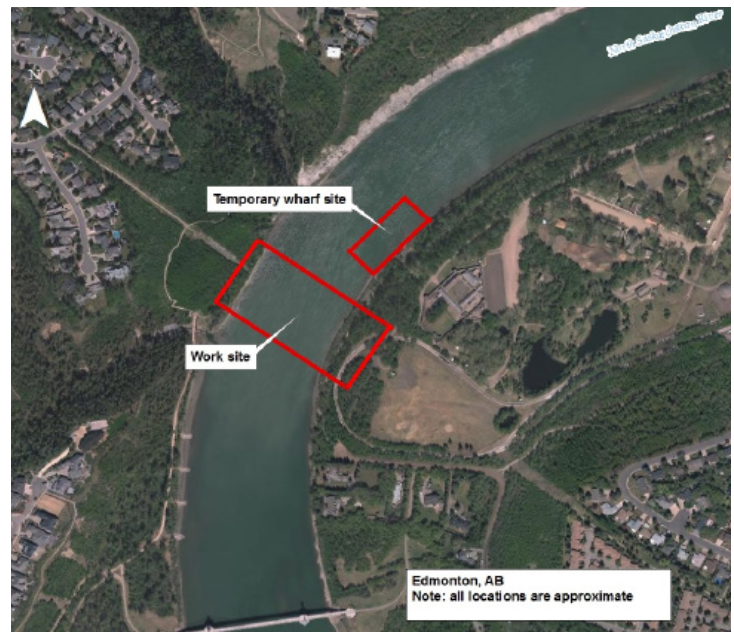
This work is not related to the Trans Mountain Expansion Project.

The purpose of this work is to install protective armoured covering over a segment of the existing pipeline that crosses the North Saskatchewan River. The covering will protect and minimize the chance of the pipeline becoming exposed and coming in to contact with potential natural hazards in the river.

Project timeline*:

- August 21—29: Site preparation and construction of temporary wharf and docking materials
- August 30—September 8: Installation of protective covering over pipeline
- September 9—September 30: Site demobilization and restoration of disturbed areas

This work will occur seven days a week during daytime hours. During this timeframe, the public may notice increased activity, presence of equipment and structures on and near the river, overnight lighting and intermittent construction-type noise near the work site. Temporary infrastructure, including a wharf and docking materials, will be constructed on site and situated along the east bank of the river. Two barges will also be constructed and placed in the river to hold the installation materials.



To protect public safety, temporary trail closures near the work site will be put in to effect over the course of this work. Members of the public will be asked to follow directions of the on-site project representative. Crews will monitor and control access to the work site using appropriate marking and signage as well as 24/7 security.

Measures will be in place to minimize any impacts of this work to the public and the environment. All work will be conducted under Environmental Protection and Emergency Response Plans to ensure compliance with applicable environmental regulations and requirements. Crews will abide by applicable bylaws and permit requirements and will work as quickly as possible to complete this maintenance with minimal disruption.
